The group also took part in the Green Hearts project with In Stitches, making hearts from card, paper, beads and lots of glitter and bling, to give away.



#### In Stitches - Nuneaton 2nd Mon of the month 10-1pm

From November to February, hundreds of Green Hearts have been created. These were left in different places in the community and they were also given out to visitors. Each one carried a tag inviting people to 'share a kindness'. In Stitches took part in Art Alert's 10th Anniversary celebration, hosting their own drop-in workshop and helping to make 'Mors Bags', which will be left at a local *Co-op* for shoppers to use if they have forgotten their own. Gathering Memories, a national project raising funds for the Alzheimer's Society, is challenging each of our sewers to create their own memory piece, which may be uploaded to the projects gallery. The group are also making poppies for Warwick Poppies 2018, to form a tribute to the men who died during WWI. The poppies will be displayed at St. Mary's Church in Warwick, during November and December. Along with all this, we are also pleased to be working with Alisha Miller as part of the International Women's Day celebrations.

#### **Evening Classes**


